INSTRUCTIONS

- Step One – Fill out this application and return it to the City Clerk's office (352-540-3810)
- Step Two – Proceed to the Hernando County Clerk of the Circuit Court's office (352-754-4201) for their separate application process (per Florida Statutes 521.022 attached). You will be asked to provide certain information including photos and fingerprints. This could be an estimated two month process and there will be a County fee associated with this. If approved, the County Clerk will issue a home solicitation sale permit in the form of a laminated identification card. **IF YOU ALREADY HAVE YOUR COUNTY IDENTIFICATION CARD, PROCEED TO STEP THREE.**
- Step Three – Once you are issued the above identification card, bring it back to the City Clerk's Office
- Step Four – Provide the City with \$500.00 surety bond (Ordinance No. 906 attached)
- Step Five – Pay the \$30.00 City fee made payable to the City of Brooksville (Resolution No. 92-11 attached)
- Step Six – Once all of the above requirements are met, the City will proceed with completion of this application and obtain the City Manager's approval.

501.021 Home solicitation sale; definitions.—As used in ss. 501.021-501.055:

(1) “Home solicitation sale” means a sale, lease, or rental of consumer goods or services with a purchase price in excess of \$25 which includes all interest, service charges, finance charges, postage, freight, insurance, and service or handling charges, whether under single or multiple contracts, made pursuant to an installment contract, a loan agreement, other evidence of indebtedness, or a cash transaction or other consumer credit transaction, in which:

(a) The seller or a person acting for him or her engages in a personal solicitation of the sale, lease, or rental at a place other than at the seller’s fixed location business establishment where goods or services are offered or exhibited for sale, lease, or rental, and

(b) The buyer’s agreement or offer to purchase is given to the seller and the sale, lease, or rental is consummated at a place other than at the seller’s fixed location business establishment,

including a transaction unsolicited by the consumer and consummated by telephone and without any other contact between the buyer and the seller or its representative prior to delivery of the goods or performance of the services. It does not include a sale, lease, or rental made at any fair or similar commercial exhibit or a sale, lease, or rental that results from a request for specific goods or services by the purchaser or lessee or a sale made by a motor vehicle dealer licensed under s. 320.27 which occurs at a location or facility open to the general public or to a designated group.

(2) “Business day” means any calendar day except Sunday or a federal holiday.

(3) “Future delivery” means delivery more than 3 business days after the buyer signs an agreement or offer to purchase.

501.022 Home solicitation sale; permit required.—

(1)(a) It is unlawful for any person to conduct any home solicitation sale, as defined in s. 501.021, or to supervise excluded minors conducting such sales provided in subparagraph (b)5., in this state without first obtaining a valid home solicitation sale permit as provided in this section.

(b) The following are excluded from the operation of this section:

1. Bona fide agents, business representatives, or salespersons making calls or soliciting orders at the usual place of business of a customer regarding products or services for use in connection with the customer's business.
2. Solicitors, salespersons, or agents making a call or business visit upon the express invitation, oral or written, of an inhabitant of the premises or her or his agent.
3. Telephone solicitors, salespersons, or agents making calls which involve transactions that are unsolicited by the consumer and consummated by telephone and without any other contact between the buyer and the seller or its representative prior to delivery of the goods or performance of the services.
4. Solicitors, salespersons, or agents conducting a sale, lease, or rental of consumer goods or services by sample, catalog, or brochure for future delivery.
5. Minors, as defined in s. 1.01(13), conducting home solicitation sales under the supervision of an adult supervisor who holds a valid home solicitation sale permit. Minors excluded from operation of this section must, however, carry personal identification which includes their full name, date of birth, residence address, and employer and the name and permit number of their adult supervisor.
6. Those sellers or their representatives that are currently regulated as to the sale of goods and services by chapter 475 or chapter 497.
7. Solicitors, salespersons, or agents making calls or soliciting orders on behalf of a religious, charitable, scientific, educational, or veterans' institution or organization holding a sales tax exemption certificate under s. 212.08(7).

(2) Applicants for permits shall file sworn applications in writing with the clerk of the circuit court for the county in which applicants intend to conduct home solicitation sales. The clerk of the circuit

court for the county is authorized to impose a reasonable permit fee sufficient to offset the administrative costs associated with the permitting procedure. Each application shall be on a form as required by the clerk of the circuit court for the county receiving the application, but shall contain the following as a minimum:

- (a) Full name of applicant.
- (b) Date of birth of applicant.
- (c) Race and sex of applicant.
- (d) Permanent residence address of applicant.
- (e) Local residence address of applicant.
- (f) Name and address of applicant's employer.
- (g) Two recent color photographs of applicant.
- (h) A statement as to whether or not the applicant has been convicted of or has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to any crime, the nature of the offense, and the punishment or penalty assessed therefor.

(i) A complete set of fingerprints taken by an authorized law enforcement agency.

(3) Upon receipt of a sworn application for a home solicitation sale permit, the clerk of the circuit court for the county shall submit the fingerprints to the Department of Law Enforcement for state processing and a copy of the application to the sheriff for a local criminal background investigation. Both the Department of Law Enforcement and the sheriff shall report any criminal justice information to the clerk of the circuit court for the county within 60 days after receipt of the fingerprints and copy of application.

(4) A clerk of the circuit court for the county may revoke, suspend, or deny the issuance of any home solicitation sale permit if it is determined that an applicant or permitholder has:

(a) Been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, a crime against the laws of this state or any other state or the United States, involving moral turpitude, fraudulent or dishonest dealing, or the illegal use or sale of a controlled substance, or been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, a violation of any of the provisions of ss. 501.021-501.055.

(b) Has obtained a permit by fraud, false statement, misrepresentation, or failure to truthfully answer any question in the required permit application.

(c) Has failed to obtain required county or municipal occupational licenses.

(d) Has failed in any material respect to comply with the provisions of ss. 501.021-501.055.

(5) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving a home solicitation sale permit, moves from the address named in such application or in the permit issued to her or him or when the name of a permitholder is changed by marriage or otherwise, such person shall within 15 days thereafter

notify the issuing clerk of the circuit court for the county in writing of her or his old and new addresses or of which former and new names and of the number of her or his permit.

(6) The issuing clerk of the circuit court for the county shall notify each applicant or permitholder of a decision to deny, suspend, or revoke a permit by certified mail sent to any one of the last addresses submitted by the applicant or permitholder.

(7) If the investigation provided for in subsection (3) reveals no grounds for denial of a home solicitation sale permit, the clerk of the circuit court for the county shall issue a home solicitation sale permit in the form of a laminated identification card which shall bear the photograph of the permitholder; the permitholder's full name, date of birth, race, and sex; the name and address of the permitholder's employer or the statement "self-employed"; the signature of the permitholder; a permit number; an expiration date; and a telephone number of the issuing clerk's office which consumers may call to verify the validity of the permit. A permit issued hereunder shall be valid for a period of 1 year from the date of issuance unless earlier revoked as provided for in this section.

(8) Every permitholder shall carry the permit and certificate required by this section at all times while engaged in home solicitation sales and shall display the same to all prospective buyers before initiating the solicitation of a sale, lease, or rental.

501.046 Home solicitation sale; duty of businesses conducting home solicitation sales.—

- (1) All businesses conducting home solicitation sales in this state shall:
 - (a) Ensure that all employees engaged in home solicitation sales obtain the permit required in s. 501.022 and direct all such employees to comply with all provisions of said section.
 - (b) Direct all employees engaged in home solicitation sales to leave with the buyer a “business card,” contract, or receipt, which shall include:
 1. The disclosure required in s. 501.031.
 2. The name, address, and telephone number of the parent company or sponsor.
 3. The name, address, and telephone number of the employee making the home solicitation sale.
- (2) In the case of telephone sales solicitations, the name, address, and telephone number of the parent company or sponsor shall be clearly and conspicuously disclosed on sales materials and contracts sent to or delivered to the buyer.

501.047 Home solicitation sale; prohibited practices.—In conducting a home solicitation, no person shall:

- (1) Misrepresent the terms or conditions of the sale, lease, or rental.
- (2) Misrepresent the seller's affiliation with the parent company or sponsor.
- (3) Misrepresent the seller's reasons for soliciting the sale, lease, or rental of goods or services, such as participation in a contest or inability to perform any other job, when such is not a fact.
- (4) Allege or imply that the agreement to purchase, lease, or rent goods or services is noncancelable when such is not a fact.
- (5) Perform any other act which constitutes misrepresentation.

501.055 Home solicitation sale; penalties.—

(1) Violation of any of the provisions of ss. 501.025-501.047 is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(2) Any person who conducts or attempts to conduct a home solicitation sale without first obtaining and having in her or his possession a valid, current permit as required by s. 501.022 or who uses or attempts to use an expired, suspended, or revoked home solicitation sale permit in a home solicitation sale is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Upon second or subsequent conviction for violation of this subsection, the offender is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(3) Any person who uses a false or fictitious name in any application for a home solicitation sale permit or certificate as provided for in s. 501.022 or who makes a false statement, conceals a material fact, or otherwise commits a fraud in any such application is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Upon a second or subsequent conviction for violation of this subsection, the offender is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. The obtaining of two or more permits which are in different names or the possession of two or more such permits shall be prima facie evidence that this subsection has been violated.

ORDINANCE NO. 906

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING ARTICLE V, "PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS," OF CHAPTER 78, "TAXATION, BUSINESS LICENSES AND SPECIAL PERMITS," OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO CHANGE REFERENCES TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE; TO MAKE MINOR REVISIONS IN TERMS OF ORDINANCE; TO ADDRESS ISSUES REGARDING PRESENCE ON PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY; AND PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS, SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Article V, "Peddlers and Solicitors", of Chapter 78, "Taxation, Business Licenses and Special Permits," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Brooksville are hereby amended to read as follows

ARTICLE V. - PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS

Sec. 78-221. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Fixed location means a property classified as a commercial zoning district in which the applicant has submitted his intent to transact all of his business activity from this single location.

Peddler, which includes transient merchant, transient vendor or itinerant merchant, means any individual, whether as owner, agent or employee, whether a resident of the city or not, traveling either by foot, automobile, truck or other type of conveyance, from place to place, from house to house, or from street to street, who engages in the temporary business of selling and delivering goods, wares or merchandise of any type within the city, or who makes sales and delivers articles to purchasers, or offers same for sale, or who, without traveling from place to place, shall sell or offer the same for sale from an automobile, truck or other vehicle or conveyance or who shall perform the above activities at a fixed location.

Roadway means that portion of a highway or street improved, designated or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic/travel including the shoulder and inclusive of any median area contained therein, including the entire width between the

boundary lines of any roadway of whatever nature when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for the purpose of vehicular traffic.

Solicitor and *canvasser* mean any individual, whether a resident of the city or not, traveling either by foot, automobile, truck or other type of conveyance, from place to place, from house to house, or from street to street, taking or attempting to take orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, personal property of any nature whatsoever for future delivery, or for services to be furnished or performed in the future, whether or not such an individual has, carries or exposes for sale a sample of the merchandise of such sale or whether he is collecting advanced payments on such sales or not, and whether for present or future delivery.

Sec. 78-222. - Persons excluded from provisions of this article requiring permit.

No permit shall be required by:

- (1) Those persons soliciting votes for a political candidate or for the support of a present political issue or candidate.
- (2) Solicitors, salesmen or agents making a call or business visit upon the express invitation, oral or written, of the inhabitant of the premises.
- (3) Solicitors, salesmen at a public event which has already received a special event permit after receipt of approval by the city manager, or designee.

Sec. 78-223. - Permit required.

It shall be unlawful for any peddler, solicitor or canvasser to engage in such business within the city without first obtaining a permit from the city manager, or designee, in accordance with the provisions of this article. All applications for permits must be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the applicant's desired start date for activities covered by this article.

Sec. 78-224. - Permitting of peddlers, solicitors or canvassers.

All peddlers, solicitors or canvassers shall apply to the city manager, or designee, for a permit to engage in such business. The applicant shall complete an affidavit on a form to be furnished by the city manager, or designee, which shall provide, at a minimum, the following information:

- (1) Name and date of birth of the applicant.
- (2) Permanent home address and full local address of the applicant.
- (3) A brief description of the nature of the business and the goods to be sold.
- (4) The name and address of the employer furnishing the goods to be sold.
- (5) The name and address of any employees of the registrant who will also be soliciting or canvassing within the city.
- (6) Door-to-door or location at which business is to be transacted; subject to meeting land use/zoning and safety regulations if set up at a fixed location.

(7) A statement as to whether or not the applicant has been convicted of any crime, misdemeanor or violation of any municipal ordinance, including traffic violations, the nature of the offense and the punishment or penalty assessed therefor.

(8) If the business is to be transacted from a fixed location, the applicant shall submit:

a. A notarized letter of authorization from the owner of such property granting permission to the applicant to use the property as indicated; and

b. A site sketch showing pertinent information on how the applicant plans to set up this activity at the fixed location.

Sec. 78-225. - Fees.

Except for those individuals engaged in interstate commerce or representing religious or charitable entities, the application fee for a permit for peddlers, solicitors and canvassers shall be established by resolution of the city council. No fees shall be charged for the issuance of a permit to those individuals engaged in interstate commerce or representing religious or charitable entities. To qualify as a religious or charitable organization such organization must show it is exempted as set forth in F.S. ch. 496 as presently existing or as hereinafter amended.

Sec. 78-226. - Surety payment.

Prior to the issuance of any permit, every applicant shall file with the city manager, or designee a surety bond running to the city and the citizens thereof in the amount of \$500.00 with surety acceptable to and approved by the city manager, or designee conditioned that the applicant shall fully comply with the provisions of the Code of the city and the statutes of the state regulating and concerning the business of solicitors and guaranteeing to any citizen of the city doing business with the solicitor or peddler that the property purchased will be delivered according to the representations of said solicitor or peddler. Action on such bond may be brought by any citizen of the city. No surety shall be required of any individual engaged in interstate commerce.

Sec. 78-227. - Exhibition of permit.

All individuals coming under the provisions of this article shall carry on their person, and exhibit upon request by valid authority, a permit required by this article.

Sec. 78-228. - Issuance of permit.

(a) No permit shall be issued by the city manager, or designee until the applicant shall have complied with all the provisions and requirements of this article.

(b) Before any permit shall be issued under the provisions of this article, the applicant shall have paid the required application fee as provided by resolution of

the city council and shall have posted the surety bond as required in section 78-226.

(c) Each permit issued under the provisions of this article shall be signed by the city manager, or designee. Each permit shall be dated as of the date of its issuance and shall state the date of its termination on the face thereof.

(d) Permits issued under the provisions of this article shall be valid for a time period not to exceed three consecutive calendar months.

(e) No peddler's, solicitor's or canvasser's permit shall be issued to a corporation, partnership or other similar legal entity. Permits shall only be issued to individual persons and shall not be assigned nor may the permit be used by any agent or representative of any permitted person.

Sec. 78-229. - Contents of permits.

All permits issued pursuant to the provisions of this article shall have been issued, with the applicant's indication, in writing, of full understanding to the applicable provisions of F.S. ch. 501 relating to home solicitation sales.

Sec. 78-230. - Hours of operation.

It shall be unlawful for any peddler, solicitor or canvasser required to be permitted by this article to engage in the business of peddling, soliciting or canvassing within the city between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:30 a.m. the following morning, or at any time on Sundays, except by specific appointment with or invitation from the prospective customer. Peddlers, solicitors and canvassers operating from an approved fixed location within the city's jurisdiction are exempt from this provision.

Sec. 78-231. - Entrance to premises; request to leave residential or business premises.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any peddler, solicitor or canvasser to enter upon any residential or business premises when the same are posted with a sign stating "No Peddlers Allowed" or "No Solicitations Allowed" or other words to such effect.

(b) No person shall remain in or upon any residential or business premises for soliciting or peddling when the owner or occupant thereof has requested any such person to leave.

Sec. 78-232. - Solicitation on public right-of-way.

It is unlawful for any peddler, solicitor or canvasser to obstruct, hinder or impede the free and uninterrupted passage of any vehicle, traffic or pedestrian located in any public right-of-way, street, sidewalk or other public place. A pedestrian being physically present in the vehicular travel lanes of a public right-of-way for a purpose other than merely walking along the side of the road or crossing the road to get to the other side shall be considered prima facie evidence of obstructing, hindering or impeding the free and uninterrupted passage of traffic.

Secs. 78-233—78-260. - Reserved.

SECTION 2. CONFLICTS. All ordinances, or parts thereof, and resolutions in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. Should this Ordinance contain provisions herein that are in conflict with any laws, rules, or regulations of higher authority, or be declared null and/or void of constitutional authority by courts of competent jurisdiction, such provisions so declared shall stand severed herewith and in which case all remaining provisions of this Ordinance not so declared, shall stand and continue in effect and shall take effect upon passage and will remain in force until superseded, supplemented, amended, repealed or otherwise altered.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Brooksville City Council.

WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted Ordinance No. 507 which provides for the permitting of peddlers, canvassers and solicitors; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 507 requires each peddler, solicitor or canvasser to obtain a permit; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 507 Section 1.05 stipulates an application fee to obtain said permit from all peddlers, canvassers and solicitors, except those individuals engaged in interstate commerce.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Brooksville, Hernando County, Florida, as follows:


1. An application fee of \$30 shall be charged for each application submitted, the purpose of which is to obtain a peddler, solicitor or canvasser permit.


